1 Yleistä

Fingridin toiminnassa tulee noudattaa Suomen ja Euroopan yhteisön kilpailuoikeuden periaatteita ja säännöksiä. Jokaisen Fingridissä toimivan tehtävänä on omalta osaltaan huolehtia, että Fingridissä noudatetaan voimassa olevaa kilpailulainsäädäntöä. Sama velvollisuus koskee myös yhtiön asiakaselimiä.

Tähän ohjeeseen on koottu kilpailulainsäädäntöön liittyvät periaatteet ja säännöt, joita noudatetaan Fingridin asiakaselimissä. Ohjeen toisessa luvussa esitellään kilpailulainsäädäntöön liittyvät keskeiset säännöt ja kolmannessa luvussa niiden huomiointi Fingridin asiakaselinten toiminnassa.

2 Keskeisimmät kilpailusäännöt

Kilpailua rajoittavat sopimukset

Sellaiset elinkeinonharjoittajien väliset sopimukset, elinkeinonharjoittajien yhteenliittymien päätökset sekä elinkeinonharjoittajien yhdenmukaistetut menettelytavat, joiden tarkoituksena on merkittävästi estää, rajoittaa tai vääristää kilpailua tai joista seuraa, että kilpailu merkittävästi estyy, rajoittuu tai vääristyy, ovat kiellettyjä.

Guidelines concerning customer bodies

At meetings, clear agenda, presentation materials, minutes

Meetings material is published simultaneously for both members and third parties

Information concerning an individual company is not processed

Other confidential information characterised by the following is not processed:

- not available from public sources (such as FG's website)
- topicality
- can influence market behaviour

A list of typical confidential information

When turning discussion to a forbidden area, processing is suspended

Implementation

Guidelines are reviewed in committees

A new member must always read them

Compliance with guidelines is particularly monitored by Fingrid's representatives in committees and by chairpersons

Practical arrangements

- The group's aim is to convene twice a year.

- Agendas and minutes are published on Fingrid's website.




Aims



Toolbox talks

- A toolbox talk is a short event lasting about 15
 minutes, dealing with topical occupational safety
 issues. A toolbox talk may be held, for example, by a
 supervisor, someone responsible for the site,
 another person appointed by the main contractor or
 a representative of the client.
- The aim of a toolbox talk is to improve awareness of and attitudes to occupational safety at Fingrid sites, and to ensure communication with all employees about, among other things, site risk factors, amendments to safety rules, and accidents and dangerous situations that have occurred.
- A toolbox talk should be clear and limited to a topic concerning occupational safety. A toolbox talk should be a two-way event, in which employees can give suggestions for improvement to the person holding the event. Suggestions for improvement should be recorded and, if necessary, committed to and
 scheduled.




A- and B-class events 1 January - 27 November 2017

A serious accident resulting in absence.

- A serious accident resulting absence occurred in May 2017 at a Fingrid site.
 - A two-person team was transporting the pieces of a horizontal brace from a dismantled tower out of a forest. The pieces were attached to a hoisting machine at the rear of an off-road vehicle equipped with tracks.
 - The timber hit the worker in the leg, causing a severe fracture.

Identify dangers and determine the danger zones of moving machines

 Risk factors must be identified as extensively as possible in advance. The risk assessment must also take into account moving machines and their danger zones. In transportation, the load must be attached so that it cannot be caught in anything. It is important that employees receive instruction in the identified danger zones of machines and safe working methods.

Fatal accident on a transmission line site 25 August 2017



- XX was working on the cross-arm beside the outermost phase conductor
- The outermost phase conductor was fastened
- NN was presumably near the middle phase conductor at the time of the fall
- NN fell 16 meters to the ground
- YY was working on the ground near the foot of the tower

The eight most important steps

- Structural safety and guidelines for working at height
- Tightening of penalty practices and training about intervening in unsafe operations
- Surprise inspections in projects.
- Improvement in the work of the safety supervisor
- Requirements specified at start-up meetings for a work stage
- Training videos about working at height and additional earthing.
- Clarification of earthing practices
- Specifications of occupational safety practices projectspecifically

Penalty practices 2018 (Draft)

Violations of the following safety rules are subject to penalty as outlined below in this section:

- Neglecting the use of high-visibility clothing
- Neglecting the use of helmet with chin strap
- Neglecting the use of protective footwear
- Neglecting the use of eye protection at a construction site
- Neglecting the "always attached" principle with safety harnesses
- Violating safety instructions in a way that compromises safety at the site
- Absence of an ID card with a photo and tax number

Penalty practices 2018 (Draft)

The Client shall immediately report all such incidents to the project managers, site manager, and the person guilty of the violation. Whenever possible, the violation is immediately recorded in the site journal and always in the records of the next site meeting (the violation, date, name, employer, person who detected the violation). The following penalties are imposed for violations:

- 1. A fine of EUR 1,000 for the Supplier for each individual violation case
- 2. The person guilty of violation is given a written warning for the first violation. If the same person violates safety rules again, he/she is given a written warning and removed from the site for the remainder of the day. If the same person violates safety rules at Fingrid's site for the third time, he/she is banned from Fingrid sites for the minimum of two years.
- 3. In serious cases of violation, the guilty party is immediately banned from Fingrid sites for the minimum of two years. Serious violations include neglect of the "Always attached" method, connecting earthing in a prohibited way or failing to connect it at all, failing to use a helmet and lack of high-visibility clothing. The duration of the ban from sites is considered on a case-by-case basis, and extenuating circumstances may be taken into consideration.
